Module Variations allow for the individual styling of each module within a position, without it being global. Code wise, this is achieved by adding a class into the module code which loads from the **Module Class Suffix** field in the Module Manager. The theme CSS adjusts accordingly.

Enter any available suffixes at **Extensions** ▢ **Module Manager** ▢ **Module** ▢ **Module Class Suffix**

There are 11 suffixes: **tab1-3**, **bg1-3**, **underline**, **number** and **flush**, **flushtop**, **flushbottom**.

The **Tab** suffixes add a solid background image behind the header, in the shape of a tab. The **B** **G**

suffixes change the color of the module background only.

### **Underline**

simply adds a border to the bottom of the module header. Remember, you can always combine suffixes together such as

**tab3 b2**

, which will produce a colored module title, with a colored background.

### **Number**

is specifically designed for the menu module, adding a decimal list before the border graphic.

**Flush** will disable all padding and margin to the module for a tighter fit, with **FlushTop** and **FlushBottom**

disabling the margin/padding for the Top/Bottom parts of the module respectively.
